UPDATE:

In the month of December during our Annual Christmas Project, God poured His power, provision and protection over John and the rest of the team. We were able to donate over 2000 packages to impoverished children and provide over 5 tons of food for needy families. Nearly 900 people heard the Gospel for the first time; almost all received healing in their bodies and accepted Christ in their hearts. People in this part of the country are very religious. It's hard for them to let go of old traditions and rituals. That's why during these meetings, before we gave the food, John felt in his spirit to pray for people to receive physical healing in their bodies. We find that when the Lord heals them, they are more open to receiving Jesus as their personal Savior. He then shared the Word with them explaining that it was Jesus that healed them. Lastly, John invited them to accept the "Healer" into their hearts. When they see that Jesus performs signs and wonders among them, they realize that their old religion couldn't offer them these kinds of results. We then distributed a bag of 10 lbs of food to each person and a New Testament for those who requested one.

Our deepest desire for 2017 is to continue depopulating hell and populating heaven. Here at JMM we do not consider ourselves merely a humanitarian ministry. We do provide food, hygienic supplies and occasionally clothing for needy people during our outreaches and crusades but our main focus is on sharing the Gospel with the hurting. We strive to bring them the uncompromised Word of God and introduce them to Jesus who saves, heals, restores, delivers and will provide for their every need.

2. Plant your seed using supernatural faith with expectation

- Sow in the direction of your greatest need
- Have a picture of your seed in your mind- your faith needs a picture
- Do not expect anything less than what your seed was designated for

The difference between famine and fertile season is your faith; God can cause you flourish when you believe Him and operate through faith. In order to reach this level of faith we must replace the natural (what we see with our eyes) with the supernatural (that which is unseen- Heb 11:1). This is only possible by feeding on the Word every day. **The more Word we have stored, the more Word we speak, the more our faith is activated.** We must not waver after we have sowed our seed (James 1:6) but instead we must continue to believe for the harvest.

Our example here is Abraham. Although the fulfillment of the promise had not come to pass, God told Abraham to look up at the sky during the night and count the stars (Gen 15:5). This was a picture that He wanted Abraham to remember as he continued on his journey with no sign of the promise. In Gen 22:17 God paints another picture for Abraham, this time during the day, telling him to look at the sand, *"I will bless you and in multiplying I will multiply your descendants like the stars of the heavens and like the sand on the seashore."*

Every single one of us plants seeds into someone else's life every single day. Many times we aren't even aware that we do it. Every single word and every action is a seed that we sow. It may not be of much significance to us but we have no idea how it can affect the person on the other side. Let's go into 2017 being mindful of every seed we sow and sow on purpose!

God will never ask you to sow without expecting Him to come through for you! Get in the habit of naming your seed and expecting the harvest. This will give your faith potential to increase. When a farmer sows his seed into the ground, he isn't taking the seed out every day to look at it; <u>he is waiting in anticipation for the harvest</u>. The same goes for our seeds. **We sow them, believe with our supernatural faith and expect the harvest from God.** A farmer also knows that it takes time for a seed to produce a harvest. It doesn't happen overnight. Some seeds take longer than others to produce the results that we are believing for. **But we must not cancel our blessings by speaking negatively while we are in the waiting season.** The waiting season is often the most trying season but it also produces patience which produces character and character produces hope (Rom 5:4). Galatians 6:9 says, "*Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up.*"

Think you don't have a seed to sow? It's usually during times of crisis that God will ask us to sow a seed. It's all part of trusting Him. Don't look at your current circumstance with your carnal mind. Prayer can be a seed, kind words are seeds, a smile can be a seed. We serve a great God and He will always give us the seed that we need in that very moment to plant in someone's life. A seed planted is a blessing for the one planting and the one receiving; it can even change a life.

We remain focused on winning souls for the Kingdom in 2017! Together with your prayers and financial support we will fulfill every good work that God sets before us this year and He alone will receive the GLORY!
