ETTER The voice of those who escaped from the iron curtain

Please keep our team from America and the others that have joined them overseas in your prayers until they return home safely. At the time of this letter, they have finished packaging the goody bags and are on the mission field distributing them. They have a long journey ahead of them. Please keep them in your daily prayers for divine protection, good weather and a successful end to a great project!

And lastly as we wrap up our last newsletter of the year, the Lord put a few key verses on our heart for all of us to meditate on as we enter into the busyness of the holiday season. Most of us are all too familiar with many scriptures regarding the birth of *Jesus* and the surrounding events leading up to *His birth*. We read about them every year and sing about His miraculous birth at church during Christmas. But what about going beyond that? Are we called to simply read and sing about the wonderful birth of Jesus at Christmas and then go on with our daily routine as usual? The answer is no. It is good to give honor and glory to God the Father for sending His Son as the ultimate sacrifice for our sins but we must go *beyond* that.

The disciples went *beyond* that. In fact John the beloved shares with us his encounter with Jesus and extends to us an invitation to come into *fellowship* with Him in 1 John 1:1-3.

We are writing about the Word of Life in Him Who existed from the beginning, Whom we have heard, Whom we have seen with our own eyes, Whom we have gazed upon [for ourselves] and have touched with our own hands. And the Life [an aspect of His being] was revealed (made manifest, demonstrated), and we saw [as eyewitnesses] and are testifying to and declare to you the Life, the eternal Life in Him Who already existed with the Father and Who actually was made visible (was revealed) to us [His followers]. What we have seen and ourselves heard, we are also telling you, so that you too may realize and enjoy fellowship as partners and partakers with us. And this fellowship that we have [which is a distinguishing mark of Christians] is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ (the Messiah). (AMP)

We have not only been given a first hand testimony of the disciples who saw, touched, spoke, and walked with Jesus but we have been invited *to enjoy fellowship as partners with the Father and His Son Jesus Christ the Messiah*. The amplified Bible says that this fellowship is the **distinguishing mark of Christians**! Are we fellowship with God the Father and His Son Jesus so that people around us see the distinguishing mark of a Christian in us? Christmas should serve as a reminder of the sacrifice that God gave on our behalf but it shouldn't stop there. Fellowshipping with the Father and His Son Jesus needs to be *daily* communion as it was for the disciples. What if the disciples hadn't gone *beyond* the birth, death and resurrection of the Savior? Then the Gospel of Jesus would not have been spread to the entire earth. *Their constant fellowship with the Father*, *His Son Jesus and the Holy Spirit empowered them to become beacons of light and key players in the spreading of the Gospel of Jesus*. And we have been given the opportunity to share, as partners, in that continuous spreading of the Good News. But it begins with us going *beyond* the manger story of baby Jesus and onto that *divine fellowship*.

Furthermore, we have seen with our own eyes and now testify that the Father sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. (1 John 4:14 NLT)

As the year comes to a close, we challenge you to meditate on these wonderful passages of Scripture and keep them in the center of your Holiday festivities. Ask the Lord to help you set aside time in order for you come into fellowship with Him so you too can go *beyond*.
